A student going on a professional internship should fill out a preliminary statement, on the basis of which a contract and referral (for the employer) are created, as well as a certificate of completion of the internship, internship program, intern's time card, and learning outcomes. After completing the internship, the student submits all documentation to the university, where it is reviewed by the internship supervisor.
